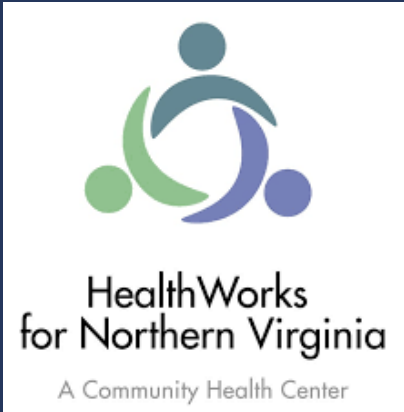

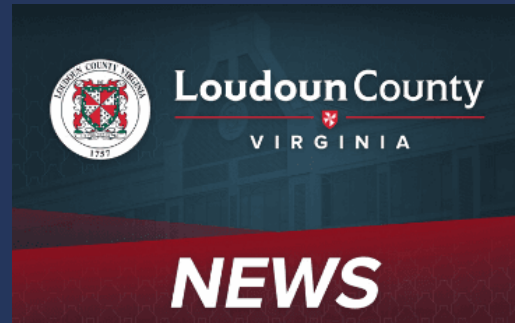
Loudoun County Launches Online Application for Rent Assistance Program

General Election**



3 Ways to Vote in the November 2020 General Election

1. Vote at Home by Mail
2. Vote Early In Person
3. Vote In Person on Election Day

Loudoun County election officials remind all registered voters in Virginia of the options to vote at home by mail, vote early in person, or vote in person on Election Day for the upcoming November general election:

- Vote at Home By Mail
- Vote Early In Person
- Vote In Person on Election Day

The deadline to register to vote or update your information is Tuesday, October 13, 2020.

If you request your ballot by mail, it's important to remember that is your official ballot and to promptly complete and return it. Ballots will not be available to be mailed to voters until September 18, 2020, but voters may apply now for an absentee ballot. Voters who have already applied for an absentee ballot do not need to submit a new application. If you've requested a ballot be mailed to you, but change your mind and decide to vote in person, please return your unmarked ballot as soon as possible to the Loudoun County Office of Elections and Voter Registration to avoid delays when you appear in person to vote.

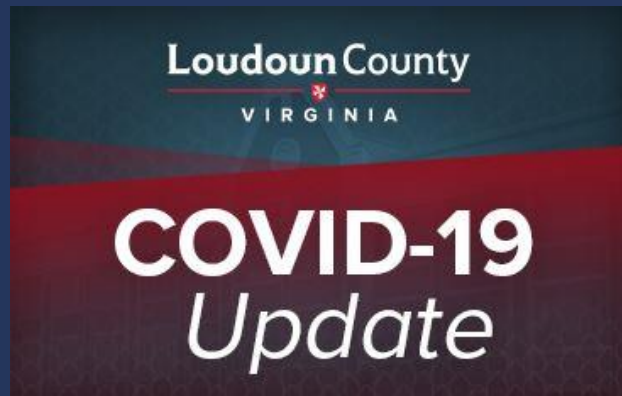

Loudoun County's Cases by ZIP Code Dashboard

The ZIP Code dashboard was updated today using the geometrical intervals method, the classification method used on the Virginia Department of Health's website.

This method distributes the data more evenly, making it possible to clearly see the differences among ZIP Codes. As more tests are conducted in the county, the classifications will be re-balanced. [See more information on this method.](#)

Census Updates



Operations for the 2020 census continue in Loudoun County, where more than 78% of households have responded. Census employees have begun visiting households that have not yet responded to the census.

The census provides critical data used to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads, and other resources based on census data. For example, for each child or adult not counted in the 2020 Census, Loudoun County expects to lose \$2,000 per year in federal funding during the next 10 years.

Households can still respond now by completing and mailing back the paper questionnaire they received, by responding online at 2020.Census.Gov, or by phone at [844-330-2020](tel:844-330-2020). Households can respond online or by phone in one of 13

languages and find assistance in many more. Those that respond will not need to be visited to obtain their census response.

- Learn resume writing best practices



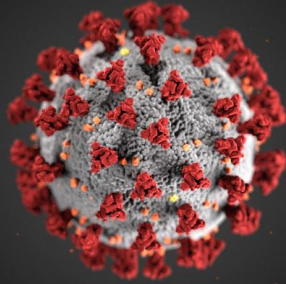

The county continues to encourage everyone in the community to take steps to limit the spread of COVID-19, which include:
