COVID-19 Vaccine: 8 Things to Know



The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) has announced vaccination priorities for the Commonwealth as well as plans to begin distributing and administering COVID-19 vaccine before the end of the year.

The creation and distribution of COVID-19 vaccine is one of the most critical steps toward

protecting those at highest risk of the disease and eventually bringing an end to the pandemic. Virginia's COVID-19 Vaccination Priorities Announced

As COVID-19 cases continue to rise in Virginia, implementing a successful vaccination program is critical to flattening the curve and stopping the spread of this virus. Based on new information provided on December 3 by the federal government's Operation Warp Speed, Virginia is now preparing to receive an estimated total of 480,000 doses of vaccine from two manufacturers (Pfizer and Moderna) by the end of December 2020.



This initial distribution will ensure 480,000 health care personnel (HCP) and long-term care facility (LTCF) residents receive a first dose of the vaccine, beginning the inoculation process for nearly all members of Virginia's two top-priority groups, if we receive this expected allotment. The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) estimates that there are up to 500,000 HCP and LTCF residents in Virginia.

The actual amount of vaccine received in Virginia is a moving target and dependent on when and how quickly vaccination doses are manufactured. VDH is coordinating future prioritization based on federal guidance.

Loudoun County has scheduled another free drive-thru COVID-19 testing event:

Sunday, December 13, 2020, from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. at Potomac Falls High School, 46400 Algonkian Parkway, Potomac Falls.

The testing event is open to all. There are no age or residency requirements. No prescriptions or appointments are necessary. A person does not have to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 in order to be tested. A PCR test (nasal swab) will be administered, which tests for the novel coronavirus. No antibody or rapid tests will be offered.

How Long Should You Quarantine if Exposed to COVID-19?

On December 2, 2020, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reiterated its endorsement of 14 days of quarantine for close contacts of a person with COVID-19, but provided options to localities to consider shorter quarantine periods based



on local circumstances and resources. You may have heard about this as this topic was widely reported in the news, which may cause some confusion over just how long you should quarantine if you are exposed to a person who has COVID-19.

At this time, there are no change to the quarantine guidelines in our community. Consistent with the CDC's and Virginia Department of Health's current guidelines, the Loudoun County Health Department continues to recommend that people who have had close contact with someone who has COVID-19 stay home and away from others for 14 days after the last contact with the person who has COVID-19. Close contact is defined as being within six feet of a COVID-19 positive person for a cumulative period of at least 15 minutes over a 24 hour period.

Dulles Toll Road to Go Cashless



In response to customers' preference for electronic toll payments, the Dulles Toll Road will be going permanently cashless on January 1, 2021. Manual toll collecting was ended on April 6, as part of the Virginia Department of Transportation's response to COVID-19. This change will

now become permanent with the road moving to all electronic tolling.

In addition, loose change will no longer be accepted and tollbooth change baskets will be removed.

All lanes on the Dulles Toll Road are equipped with electronic tolling, which accept the following forms of payment:

- Any lane can be used with a valid E-ZPass account or other form of electronic tolling. Customers can visit [E-ZPass Virginia](#) for information on how to obtain an E-ZPass. If toll-lane cameras identify a license plate associated with an E-ZPass account, that account will be charged for the transaction even if an E-ZPass is not present in the vehicle. To make it easier to get an E-ZPass, the minimum opening account balance has been temporarily reduced to \$20.00 per transponder (from \$35.00) for online and phone applications. E-Z Pass also offers a reloadable Virginia E-Z Pass Card, these can be purchased your local CVS Pharmacy and 7-11 Convenience Stores.
- The [GoToll](#), [Slora](#) and [Peasey Drive On](#) smartphone apps are also accepted as payment.
- Motorists passing through all toll plaza lanes without electronic payment will be sent a payment notice by mail. Missed tolls which are paid within **six days of the violation** will not be charged an administrative fee. Customers are encouraged to visit the [Virginia Department of Transportation's online toll violation payment website](#) for information on proactively paying missed tolls.

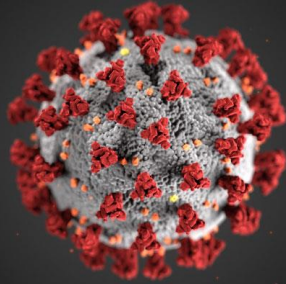
The meeting will include an opportunity to receive public comments following agency presentations on transportation initiatives, including:
