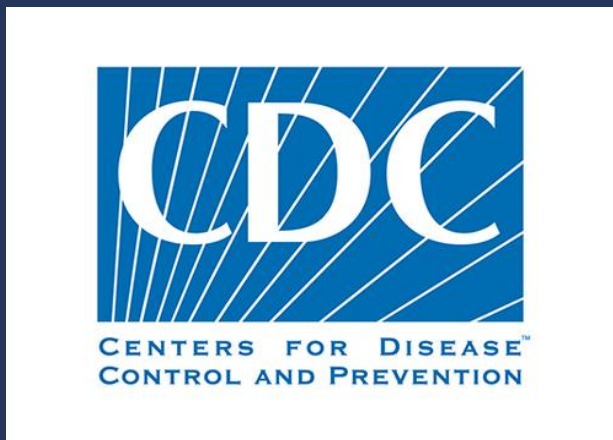

### Delaying Medical Care Due to COVID-19



An estimated 41% of adults in the United States have avoided or delayed medical care, including urgent or emergency care and routine care, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Health officials encourage everyone who has put off a screening, especially screenings for cancer, to see their health care provider.

Screening means checking your body for cancer before you have symptoms. Getting screening tests regularly may find breast, cervical, and colorectal (colon) cancers early, when treatment is likely to work best. Lung cancer screening is recommended for some people who are at high risk.

## Loudoun County Schedules Free COVID-19 Testing Events through June

Loudoun County will continue to hold free, drive thru COVID-19 testing events through June.

The events are scheduled for **Tuesdays, 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.**, at the following locations:

- **June 8:** Franklin Park, 17501 Franklin Park Drive, Purcellville (Follow signs to the baseball field parking lot.)
- **June 15:** Philip A. Bolen Memorial Park, 42405 Claudia Drive, Leesburg (Enter the park on Crosstrail Boulevard from Sycolin Road.)
- **June 22:** Cascades Library, 21030 Whitfield Place, Potomac Falls (Access the testing location in the back parking lot, near the senior center.)
- **June 29:** Dulles South Recreation & Community Center, 24950 Riding Center Drive, South Riding

The testing events are free and open to all. There are no age or residency requirements. No prescriptions or appointments are necessary. A person does not have to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 to be tested. A PCR test (nasal swab) will be administered, which tests for the novel coronavirus. No antibody or rapid tests will be offered. **No COVID-19 vaccine will be available at these events.**

At the May 18, 2021 business meeting, the Board of Supervisors approved renaming primary roads Harry Byrd Highway (Route 7) and John Mosby Highway (Route 50), with a timeline that will extend into 2022 and includes public outreach.

## Board of Supervisors Adds Meetings to June Calendar



The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors has added two meetings to its June 2021 calendar.

- **Wednesday, June 9:** The Board will hold a special business meeting **Wednesday, June 9, 2021, 5:00 – 6:00 p. m.** to hear public input on land use planning in the village of St.

Louis. This meeting will immediately precede the Board's regular monthly public hearing scheduled to begin at 6:00 p.m., June 9.

- **Monday, June 21:** The Board will hold a special meeting **Monday, June 21, 2021, beginning at 6:00 p.m.** to consider revised guidelines for the 2021 redistricting process. Redistricting occurs every 10 years following the United States decennial census.

The meetings will take place in the Board Room in the Loudoun County Government Center, 1 Harrison Street, SE in Leesburg and will be televised on Comcast Government Channel 23 and Verizon FiOS Channel 40 and livestreamed

The Loudoun County Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) was recognized for excellence in facility projects and programs completed in 2020 by the National Association of County Park and Recreation Officials (NACPRO) and the National Association of Counties (NACo).



NACPRO recognized the enhancement and redevelopment project at Gwen Thompson Briar Patch Park in Sterling, Virginia, in the Park and Recreation Facility Class I award category for providing outstanding efforts in planning, design, construction and benefits to the community. NACPRO also recognized the PRCS Adaptive Recreation Summer Camp in the Removing Barriers Initiative category as a program that enables and encourages greater participation in parks and recreation by persons with disabilities.

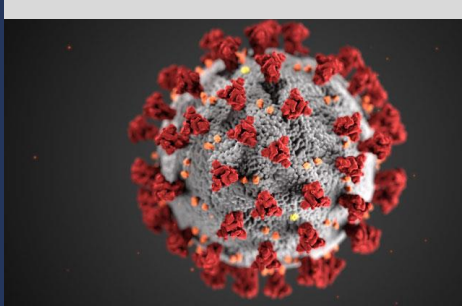
