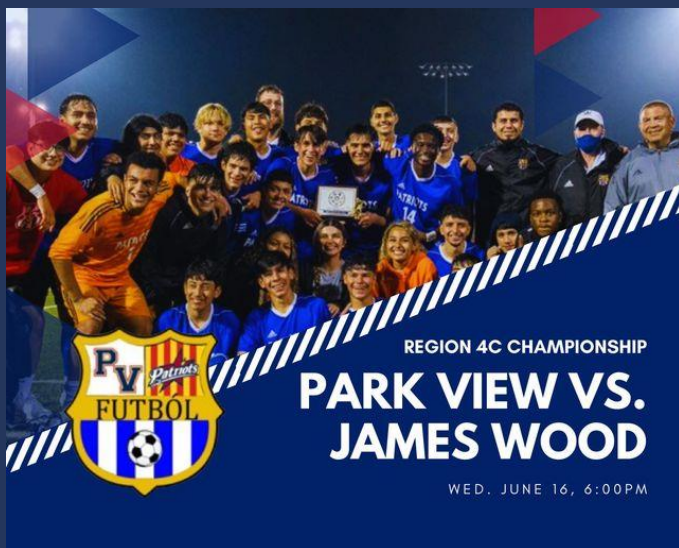

Governor Northam Launches Return to Earn Grant Program to Help Virginians Transition Back to Work

Governor Ralph Northam recently announced a new \$3 million investment to pilot the Return to Earn Grant Program, which will match payments from eligible small businesses to provide new hires with up to \$1,000 to support their transition back into the workforce.

While many companies are offering hiring bonuses, the Return to Earn Grant Program will serve businesses with less than 100 employees that may not have the resources to provide this financial support.

The initial launch of this program will be funded through Virginia's federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) set aside and additional recovery funds may be allocated based on demand.

REMINDER: Community COVID-19 Vaccination Events Scheduled in Loudoun

Several community events offering COVID-19 vaccine to members of the public are scheduled in Loudoun County over the coming weeks. Vaccinations are free of charge for everyone regardless of immigration or health insurance status.

The events will offer the 2-dose Pfizer vaccine to anyone 12 and older.

The vaccination events are open to anyone on a first-come, first-served basis as long as vaccine supplies last; however, appointments are also available through pre-registration.

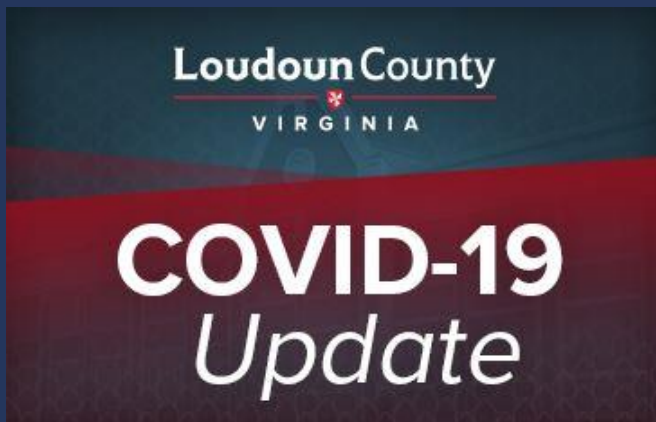

County Ends Shuttle Service at COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Site



Due to low ridership, Loudoun County will cease operating the free shuttle service between the Loudoun County Transit bus stop at Dulles Town Center and the county's COVID-19 vaccination site located at the other end of the shopping mall. The last day of operation was scheduled for Saturday, June 12, 2021.

Ridership on the free shuttle has consistently been extremely low, often having no riders on days the vaccination clinic was open.

The shuttle began operating in early May as a courtesy to eliminate the need to travel around or through the shopping mall to the vaccination site for people who arrive at the Dulles Town Center via the [Loudoun County Transit Local Bus service](#) and who may have difficulty walking long distances.

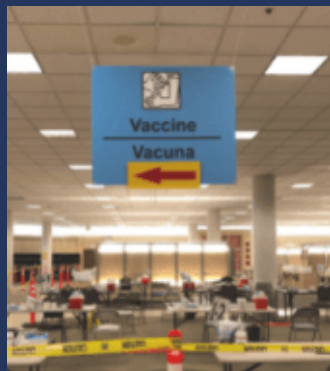
As a reminder, to get to the vaccination site on a Loudoun County Transit Local Bus, riders may choose from Routes 62, 70, 81, 82 or 84, which serve the Dulles Town Center. Fares for the local bus are \$1 each way.

Loudoun County is now offering walk-in service at the COVID-19 vaccination clinic at Dulles Town Center. Anyone 12 years of age and older is eligible to receive a free COVID-19 vaccine on a first-come, first-served basis during the clinic's hours of operation. The clinic's schedule is posted at loudoun.gov/covid19vaccine.

REMINDER: Walk-in Service Available at County Vaccination Clinic; Hours of Operation Being Adjusted

Loudoun County is now offering walk-in service at the COVID-19 vaccination clinic located at Dulles Town Center, 21090 Dulles Town Circle in Sterling.

Individuals 12 years and older are eligible for vaccination on a first-come, first-served basis during the clinic's scheduled hours of operation. No appointment is necessary; however, appointments are still available.

Loudoun County will continue to hold free, drive thru COVID-19 testing events through June.

The events are scheduled for **Tuesdays, 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.**, at the following locations:

- **June 22:** Cascades Library, 21030 Whitfield

Place, Potomac Falls (Access the testing location in the back parking lot, near the senior center.)

- **June 29:** Dulles South Recreation & Community Center, 24950 Riding Center Drive, South Riding

The testing events are free and open to all. There are no age or residency requirements. No prescriptions or appointments are necessary. A person does not have to exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 to be tested. A PCR test (nasal swab) will be administered, which tests for the novel coronavirus. No antibody or rapid tests will be offered. **No COVID-19 vaccine will be available at these events.**

School Nutrition Services will continue to provide meals to LCPS families during the summer months.

Summer service began on Monday, June 14, at all school sites. Ten days of meals will be provided at

this time.

NOTE: There will be no meal service on Monday, June 21, as the School Nutrition staff takes a brief break.

On Monday, June 28, Summer School walk-up meal service will begin. 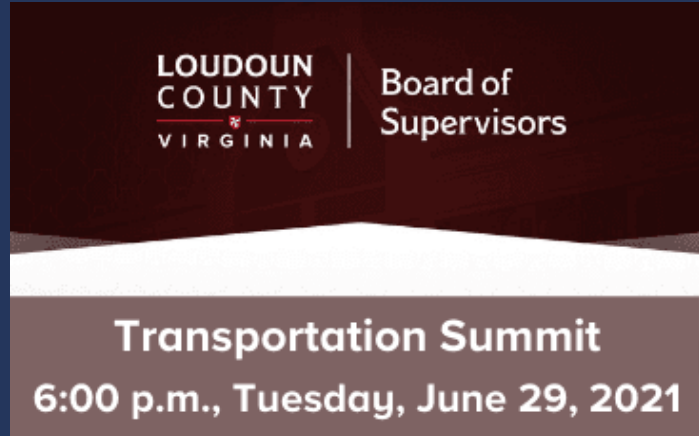

The Loudoun County Board of Supervisors has scheduled a Transportation Summit for **Tuesday, June 29, 2021, beginning at 6:00 p.m.**

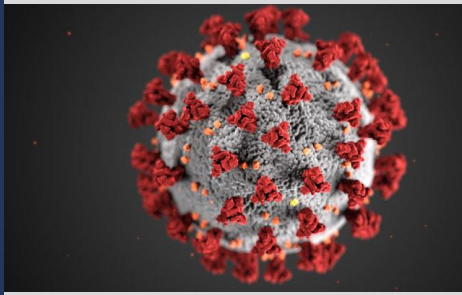
The summit is intended to provide Board members with a dedicated opportunity to discuss transportation issues, one of the Board's strategic focus areas. Representatives of the Department of Transportation and Capital Infrastructure will provide the Board with updates on several topics, including:



- An overview of how the Virginia Department of Transportation works with the county on transportation projects.
- An overview of the [Countywide Transportation Plan](#).
- A summary of the transportation project development process.
- An in-depth review of the traffic signal project development process and the county's efforts to streamline the process.
- A status report on implementation of county-led data collection and signal warrant analysis for development applications.

The Transportation Summit will take place in the Board Room of the Loudoun County Government Center, 1 Harrison Street, SE in Leesburg and will be televised on Comcast Government Channel 23 and Verizon FiOS Channel 40 and livestreamed at loudoun.gov/meetings.
