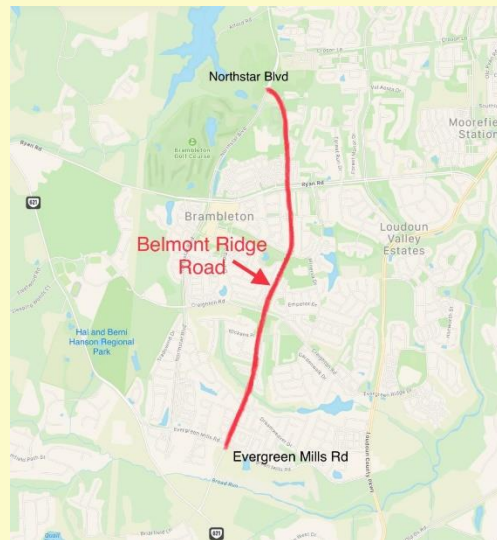

PURPOSE: To seek authorization from the Board of Supervisors (Board) to direct staff to conduct a corridor safety and operational study of Belmont Ridge Road from Northstar Boulevard to Evergreen Mills Road.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the Board direct staff to conduct a corridor safety and operational study of Belmont Ridge Road from Northstar Boulevard to Evergreen Mills Road and approve an amendment to the FY 2022 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) by authorizing the execution of a budget adjustment to transfer \$419,850 from the Capital Project Management account to the newly established capital account to fund the Belmont Ridge Road Corridor Safety and Operational Study.

I decided to submit this initiative for Board of Supervisor consideration at the request of Brambleton HOA Board of Directors President, Mr. Brian Viola, and Brambleton HOA Community Manager, Mr. Rick Stone, both of whom I'd like to thank for bringing this issue to my attention.

The now approved comprehensive analysis of the corridor will thoroughly examine existing conditions corridor conditions such as speed limits, crashes, pedestrian/bicycle safety at unsignalized intersections, and truck traffic.

The study is anticipated to begin by September of 2021, with data collection conducted under "normal traffic conditions" following the return to school. After field evaluation, the public will be informed of the findings and have an opportunity to provide input. Upon conclusion of the study, it is anticipated that County staff will present their findings and recommended road safety improvement projects to the Board of Supervisors for approval and funding consideration in the Fall of 2022.

I'm happy to see this study approved and funded and I look forward to hearing the staff recommended improvements! As always, my office will keep you informed as additional updates become available.
