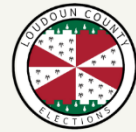

The public information meeting will be held **Wednesday, October 27, 2021, 6:00 – 7:00 p.m.** Members of the public are invited to join the virtual meeting to learn, ask questions and provide input about the project.

About the Route 7 Shared Use Path Project

The Route 7 Shared Use Path project involves the design and construction of a 10-foot-wide shared use path along the north side of Route 7 between Campus Drive (Route 391), the entrance of Northern Virginia Community College, and Lakeland Drive (Route 821) approximately 1,500 feet west of the Fairfax County line in Sterling. The total length of the proposed shared use path is approximately 1.3 miles.

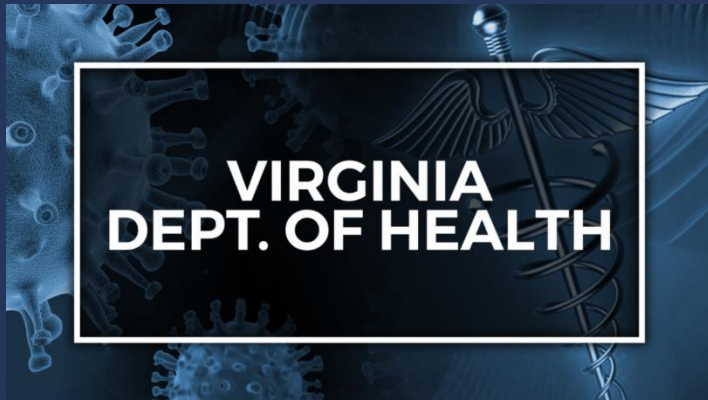

Vaccine Update

The Virginia Department of Health is planning for the expected approval of booster shots for people who have completed either the Moderna or Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine series. An [advisory panel to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) is scheduled to consider



whether to recommend the boosters when it meets October 20-21. This follows a recommendation in favor of the boosters from the Food and Drug Administration's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee.

In a statement released in response to the development, Virginia's Vaccination Liaison Dr. Danny Avula said [Virginia continues to plan for providing Moderna and Johnson & Johnson booster doses of COVID-19 vaccines](#). Virginia is already providing a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine booster dose at least 6 months after completion of the primary series, for certain individuals who received the Pfizer vaccine.

Vaccines for Children

Health officials are also planning for expected approval of COVID-19 vaccines for children. The Food and Drug Administration's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee is scheduled to meet **Tuesday, October 26**, to consider the use of a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 5 to 11. Community Development Block Grant Process is Underway in Loudoun



Loudoun County has opened the application process for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. The CDBG program provides funding on an annual basis for local projects that address a variety of housing, public service and community development needs.

Eligible applicants for CDBG funds include local nonprofit organizations and local government entities in Loudoun County or those serving Loudoun County residents. Proposed projects should address the goals of the CDBG program which include providing affordable housing opportunities, revitalizing neighborhoods, renovating substandard housing, providing public services and expanding economic development opportunities, primarily for persons of low- and moderate-income households.

Applications for the Loudoun County CDBG program must be submitted **no later than 2:00 p.m., Friday, November 5, 2021**. Late applications will not be accepted.

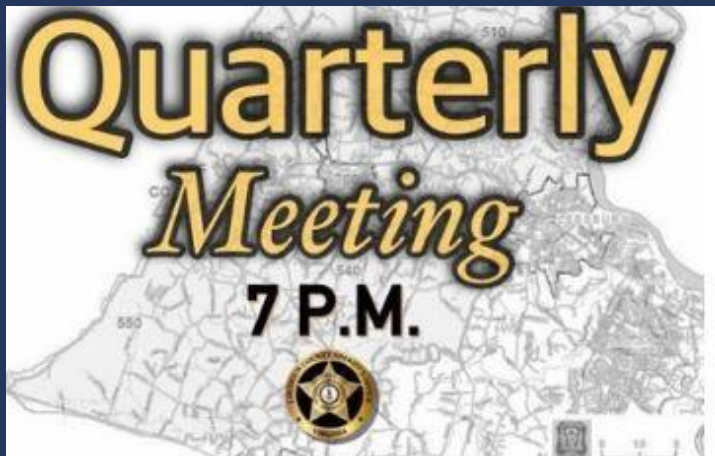

No COVID-19 vaccine will be available at these events.

Since the inception of the DEA take-back program in 2010, over 16,000 pounds of unwanted and unused prescription medications have been collected in Loudoun County.

Upcoming Low-Cost Rabies Vaccination & Microchip Clinic



Keep your pets healthy and safe by joining Loudoun County Animal Services (LCAS) at one of their low-cost rabies vaccine and microchip clinics. Dogs and cats as young as 12 weeks may participate in the clinic. Pet owners should bring their cats in carriers. Dogs must remain on a leash of six

feet or less. No flexi-leads, please. It is recommend to bring any prior vaccination records, but records are not required.

These clinics are open to all cats and dogs. Please bring cats in carriers and dogs on non-extendable leashes. This is a free clinic, there is no cost to receive a microchip for your pet.

Additional Information About the Rabies Vaccine

For the safety of pets and people, the Commonwealth of Virginia requires all cats and dogs over the age of four months to be regularly vaccinated against rabies. The majority of rabies cases occur in wildlife but when people are exposed to rabies, it is usually the result of an encounter with an infected domestic animal. Rabies is potentially contagious to pets and humans, and, when left untreated, the virus is almost always fatal. However, high rates of vaccination have led to a decline in the disease nationwide. Dogs and cats should be vaccinated against rabies, at a minimum, every three years.

Event Procedures

In accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance, it is recommended that all individuals should wear a face covering at the point of service regardless of vaccination status. Also, because of safety concerns related to the handling of various types of hazardous materials, the events feature a drive-through process in which residents are instructed to remain in their vehicles and allow event staff to unload any items accepted for disposal. To ensure everyone remains in their vehicle while at the point of service, items must not be in sealed or tied plastic bags. Staff are not allowed to open any plastic bag containing HHW.

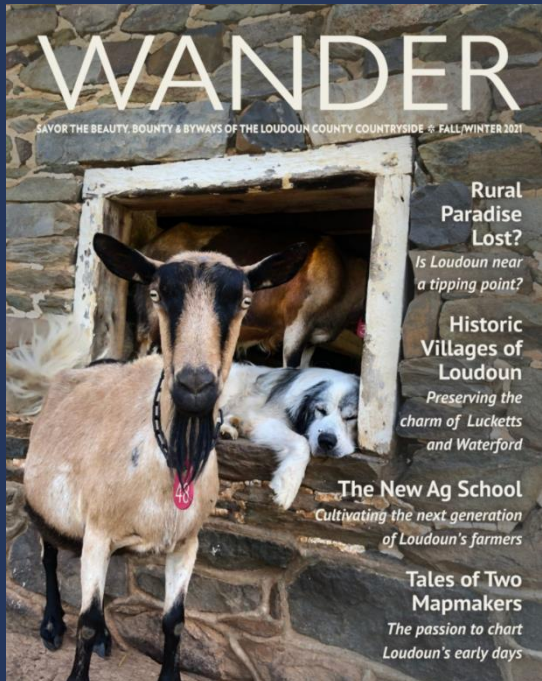

Adverse Childhood Experiences Training

The Adverse Childhood Experiences training is a one-hour educational program that aims to raise awareness of Adverse Childhood Experiences, or ACEs. ACEs are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood (0-17 years). ACEs are linked to chronic health problems, mental illness, and substance use problems in adulthood. The training teaches that ACE prevention is the greatest opportunity for improving the well-being of communities. The virtual training presentation lasts about one hour. Discussion and a question-and-answer session will follow the presentation.

Suicide Prevention Training

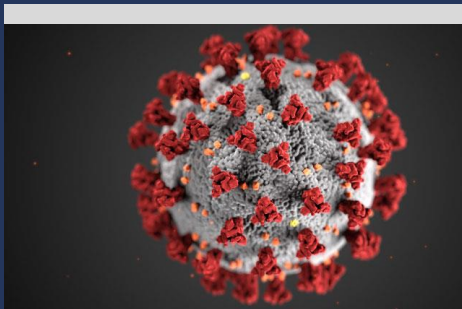
