> I just wanted to thank you for personnel like Deputy Toye at the Loudoun County Adult Detention Center. Deputy Toye has been one of the most pleasant, helpful, and knowledgeable deputies that I have come into contact with there since my son became an inmate.

>

> When you first have a family member held in the detention center, it is an extremely scary situation for both the inmate and the family. The inmate gets a handbook that helps him to adjust to the system but the family has nothing. It took us a while to find out about how visitation works, how the phone system works, and how we could help my son with the commissary account. During that "learning" period for my wife and I, we encountered a few of the other deputies there. Our experience with other deputies was much less acceptable than with Deputy Toye. We had responses to our questions with everything from short, curt, "I don't know" to "I don't know and even if I did I wouldn't tell you". We were not the prisoners, we were citizens that were just trying to find out how to do things withing the rules of the detention center.

> I first encountered Deputy Toye in the visitation area when he was passing through on his way out of the building. I don't recall the question I asked him but I do remember that he was more pleasant and helpful than anyone else that I had come into contact with there. After that we encountered Deputy Toye on a number of occasions while he was working the visitation room. Deputy Toye was always cheerful and helped us with our questions. In one instance, our son had a 14-page form that he needed to give to us so we could get it to the attorney. We couldn't figure out how to mail it when we didn't know the weight. My son had tried to figure this out by questioning other guards but without resolution. Officer Toye told us that all our son had to do was have it put in his personal property and then have him put in a request form to have it released to us. There is nothing written anywhere about this and I would never have found out this from anyone else there.

> So again, I would like to thank you for having people like Deputy Toye in the employ of the Loudoun County Sheriff's office. He is a kind, considerate, and compassionate individual. Exactly what we need in a law enforcement officer in Loudoun County.

Please extend my thanks to both of them for allowing my wife and I to come home to a super excited boy, who could hardly contain himself as he told us of his interaction with your deputies. He did add, however, that if they weren't scared, he'd give them a shot at redemption. :)

was assigned in response to two of my complaints, both filed on January 20, 2016. My first complaint regarded motorists who do not stop for the 4 p.m. middle school bus when it is stopped with red lights flashing at the intersection of Riding Center Drive and Unicorn Drive. My second complaint regarded speeders along Justice Drive between 7:30-7:50 a.m., especially during the "morning rush" to drop off students at Liberty Elementary School (LES). Justice Drive is used by many as an alternate route to Riding Center Drive in order to avoid parts of the substantial traffic back up caused by the LES drop off. Regarding my first complaint, Deputy Alpy called me late in the afternoon on January 21. He spent several minutes on the phone with me. He let me know that at approximately 4 p.m. that day, he cited a motorist for failing to stop for the middle school bus as it was disembarking students while its red lights were flashing. He also informed me that he patrolled Riding Center Drive in the vicinity of Unicorn Drive from approximately 3-4 p.m. on January 21, and, during that time, he stopped several motorists for exceeding the speed limit. During our time on the phone on January 21, we discussed various other aspects of traffic safety throughout South Riding, he answered my questions, and he let me know he would be addressing my second complaint. When I asked if I could introduce myself to him if I saw him in the neighborhood, he enthusiastically agreed that I should do so - and that I could introduce my kids as well! Regarding my second complaint, Deputy Alpy was patrolling Justice Drive on the morning of Tuesday, February 2. I introduced myself to him while he was in his unmarked cruiser; he was monitoring for speeders. He told me that he had issued one citation that morning. This was the first day students were back to school after Winter Storm Jonas; schools were operating on a two-hour delay, so the routines were not "normal." Throughout my conversations with Deputy Alpy - by phone on January 21 and in person on February 2 - he was professional, courteous, and informative. It is encouraging to know that the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office is responsive to the complaints of concerned citizens; similarly, it is heartening to know that LCSO comprises dedicated professionals like Deputy Alpy. We appreciate his dedication, and the efforts of all LCSO personnel every day - thank you.
