Belmont Ridge Road Widening Project (Truro Parish - Croson Lane)

CONSTRUCTION BEGAN YESTERDAY!

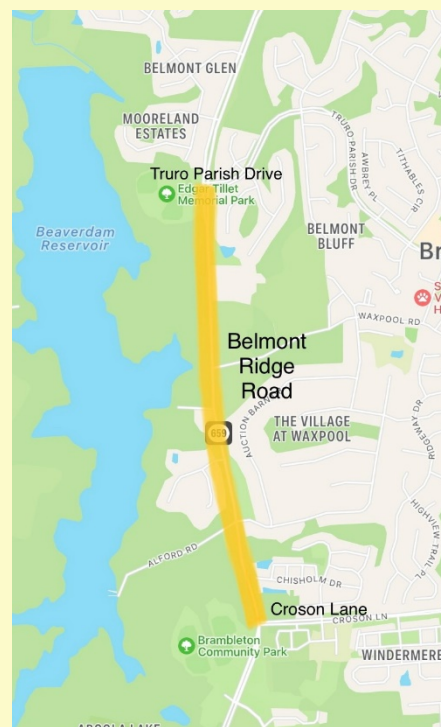
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Construction to widen Belmont Ridge Road from Truro Parish Road to Croson Lane began **YESTERDAY!**

Crews are expected to be onsite each week Monday - Friday from 7 am to 3 pm. Weather permitting, construction is expected to continue through August of 2024.

In the first phase of construction, crews will be clearing ground debris, installing erosion and sediment controls, and installing sediment basins.

Residents should expect delays during construction and avoid the area when possible.

About the Project:

This project designs and constructs two additional lanes of Belmont Ridge Road from Truro Parish Drive to Croson Lane. The improvements will consist of reconstructing and widening the existing two-lane roadway to a four-lane divided roadway with a ten foot shared use path on both sides.

The Project includes two northbound and two southbound lanes, associated turn lanes at the intersections of Croson Lane, Cochrans Lock Drive, Reservoir Ridge Place, Mount Hope Road, Waxpool Road, Black Angus Drive, Truro Parish Drive, a grass median, stormwater management facilities, landscaping, and modifications to the existing traffic signals at Croson Lane and Truro Parish Drive.

The construction phase is anticipated to last approximately 30 months, with substantial project completion anticipated in August of 2024.

Project Significance:

- The corridor is one of four major north/south roadways in Loudoun County (along with Route 15, Loudoun County Parkway and Route 28) and has been designated by the Commonwealth of Virginia as a "Corridor of Statewide Significance."
- The project provides shared use paths alongside Belmont Ridge in accordance with the Countywide Transportation Plan (CTP). The shared use paths will ultimately provide continuous access to/from the W&OD Regional Trail.
- The widening from two to four lanes will increase safety and reduce traffic congestion.

- The project upgrades a rural sub-standard two lane roadway to modern safety and level of service standards.
- The 1.5 mile segment of widening represents the last section of two lane Belmont Ridge Roadway between Route 7 and Evergreen Mills Road.
- Combined with the future completion of Northstar Boulevard, this will provide a continuous four lane divided roadway between Route 7 and Route 50.
