
Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Daily Crime Report

Eastern Loudoun Station



8/5/16-8/6/16 2100-1030 hrs.	46000 Block Courtyard Sq. Sterling	Destruction of Property: The victim reported that their vehicle's gas door was tampered with and there were multiple scratches on the car door. Also, the vehicle's tire was deflated.
8/6/16 2100-1000 hrs.	46000 Block Old Ox Rd. Sterling	Burglary: The victim reported that sometime during the night unknown suspect(s) pried open the rear door of the business and cut the power. The suspects then entered the business and stole cash and checks. This case is an active investigation.
8/6/16 0100 hrs.	Marlane Ter./ Edwards Ter. Sterling	Larceny: The victim met woman on a dating website at this location. The victim invited the woman into his vehicle and after some conversation the suspect exited the vehicle with the victim's wallet.

8/6/16 0419 hrs.	46000 Block Melrose Ct. Sterling	Assault/Arrest: The victim contacted 911 and began reporting an incident at this residence. When LCSO arrived the deputies observed a female victim inside behind the subject. The subject obstructed the entry and investigation of the incident. Also, a second male hindered the apprehension of the first suspect. Both parties were arrested and identified as Henry Y. Claros, 25, of Chantilly and Kevin C. Orosco, 23, of Sterling. Claros was charged with Drunk in Public and Obstruction of Justice. Claros was released from the Loudoun Adult Detention Center on a personal recognizance bond. Orosco was charged with Assault on Law Enforcement, Obstruction of Justice, Domestic Assault, and Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor. Orosco is being held at the Loudoun County Adult Detention Center without bond. Rescue responded and transported the victim and juvenile to a local hospital for treatment. This incident is domestic-related.
8/6/16 0433 hrs.	Bartholomew Fair Dr/ Harry Byrd Hwy. Sterling	DIP/Arrest: LCSO responded to this location for an unknown medical emergency. On scene the deputies made contact with the driver of the vehicle, who was sleeping in his car in the middle of the roadway. The driver was identified as Mario M. Martinez, 29, of Herndon. Martinez was arrested and charged with Drunk in Public, Providing False Identification to Law Enforcement and Driving without a License. Martinez was released from the Loudoun Adult Detention Center on a personal recognizance bond.
8/7/16 0150 hrs.	21000 Block Towncenter Plz. Sterling	Disorderly Conduct/Arrest: LCSO responded to this location for a male subject that was initiating physical altercations inside the business. The suspect was identified as Carlos Gonzalez-Morales, 33, of Woodbridge. Morales was arrested and charged with Drunk in Public and Disorderly Conduct. Morales was released from the Loudoun Adult Detention Center on a personal recognizance bond.

When the victim opened the register to make change, one suspect reached in and took the cash. Both males fled the scene. This case is pending.


University Station (Sectors


