On the evening of 13 July, I received one of those phone calls that all parents dread. My daughter called to tell us that she was a passenger in a car involved in an accident that had just occurred. Fortunately, she and the driver of the car she was in (and the driver of the other car) were all right.

I immediately went to the location of the accident to pick up my daughter and had the distinct (and unfortunate) pleasure in observing the efficiency and professionalism of the Deputies of the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office.

The accident scene looked horrendous. The other car had been flipped on its side, and the car my daughter was in had the entire front end pushed in. Both cars were totaled. Out of this chaos, the Deputies had already taken control and had traffic flowing.

I parked my car and met with my daughter and the driver of the car in which she was a passenger. Both were still very shook up. Deputy Stackpole (joined by another Deputy whose name, unfortunately, I do not have) then came to take their statements. Deputy Stackpole's calm demeanor and competence went a long way in calming both occupants of the car, the mother of driver of the car who had joined us, and me. Deputy Stackpole kept us informed of what was happening, of what we needed to do, and what would happen next. He was ready to answer all our questions and considerably eased what was a fairly traumatic event for us.

My daughter was a passenger in the car and we had no ongoing legal interest, the evening ended our involvement in the case. However, I understand Deputy Stackpole has continued demonstrating his professionalism when dealing with the family of the driver of the car in which my daughter was a passenger. I know these incidents (responding to traffic accidents, etc.) are routine occurrences for the Deputies of our County. I also realize we citizens of the County rarely have an opportunity to professionally interact with our Deputies and witness their dedication and competence. The only good thing that the accident afforded was the opportunity for me to be reminded of what fantastic Deputies serve our County. And I sincerely hope I don't have that opportunity again! My thanks and deep appreciation to the Sheriff's Office for all that you do.



Firstly, please accept our thanks for your attendance at this Event at which our son, Scott, was the honoree.


Secondly, thank you, again, for the response of the Department to the recent burglaries on Sagle Road. The placement of a surveillance device on that Road, as well as added patrols is much appreciated by us and by all our neighbors. Please do not remove that device any time soon! Also, we are informed that your Deputy, Charlie Gravatte, a former resident on the Road, is part of the detail attached to this response duty and we welcome that because of his familiarity with the area and previous burglaries, etc.

Thirdly, the Department's attention is invited to Case 2011-002198, burglary of firearms from our own residence at 13078 Sagle Road. Your fine CID Investigator R. Bennett, was the acting officer. This is one of several near-by cases arising early in 2011, and which are now inactive. I am assuming that, as a matter of course, the Department is examining the possible relevance of these inactive cases to the most recent burglaries and vice versa. Your confirmation in that regard would be appreciated

Fourthly, this is to ask that the Department consider use of the new firehouse (now under construction on Harper's Ferry Road, just a half-mile from its intersection with Sagle Road) as a Sheriff's Department sub-station or other supplementary function, which would establish more of a law enforcement presence in the area. Inasmuch as Sagle Road has only two through road junctions, fixed surveillance and more frequent patrols ought to be helpful. I am certain that residents threatened by these burglaries will cooperate fully with the Department in any way you find useful.

Thank you for your consideration. We look forward to your response.
