My son is 12 and this is a very impressionable age for boys, I could spend hours telling him that he shouldn't be afraid or intimidated but that conversation only goes so far. I am fully aware of the conflicting messages he is getting; at home he's told how he should trust and respect those who work to protect and serve our community but at school he hears something different. I decided to walk down to Deputy Proskey's vehicle and explain what was going on, I thought I would show my son that you can talk to any Deputy and as long as you are respectful of what they are doing and mindful not to interrupt that it's ok to reach out and interact with these Deputy's at any time. Deputy Proskey was very polite and listened to me explain why I was approaching his vehicle. He asked what my son's name was and offered to stop at our house before he left the neighborhood. True to his word, he did stop and speak with [redacted] Deputy Proskey's actions and generosity showed [redacted] more than my words ever could that he could talk to a Deputy and reinforced the messages he gets at home; there is absolutely no reason to be afraid or intimidated. The men and women that protect and serve our community are good people, they deserve our respect and gratitude for what they do and Deputy Proskey certainly

proved that tonight. I want to thank Deputy Proskey for his time, his generosity, and his thoughtfulness. Words cannot express how much it means to me that he took time to talk with [redacted] opportunities like this don't come along that often and at this impressionable age it was a wonderful thing to see [redacted] relaxed and talking with Deputy Proskey. I know how meaningful it was to Jacob also because after Deputy Proskey left [redacted] sent a text message to a bunch of his friends saying "a cop was in my neighborhood tonight and I talked to him, he was really cool!" I just wanted to briefly share some my observations regarding Deputy Joshua Santos, with whom I had the privilege of sharing a patrol car with on 20 December 2014 as part of the LCSO's Ride-Along program. This was the culmination of my recent completion of the LCSO's 34th Citizen's Police Academy.

I could not have been more impressed with the way in which Deputy Santos conducted his duties, from dealing with a couple kids involved in underage drinking, to addressing (and having to physically take down and arrest) unruly bar patrons spilling out from a local bar (Cherry Blossom in Lake Center Plaza)—and many situations in between, including dealing with individuals involved in public drunkenness, the difficult task of serving an Emergency Protective Order and conducting the associated real-time eviction, investigating reports of gunshots being fired, investigating a potential B & E, responding to 911 calls, and observing and investigating suspicious activities in general. These are "all in a night's work" for Deputy Santos and other Deputies in the County, I know. But that does not make them any less remarkable for those of us civilians in the County who benefit, and moreover are protected, as the direct result of their selfless and many-times underappreciated efforts on our behalf.

I can go into greater detail regarding each of the above incidents if you would like additional information, but suffice it to say that, in all cases, Deputy Santos was extremely polite, and even sympathetic, when dealing with the public in conjunction with the above incidents. He exemplifies the perfect combination of an iron fist in a velvet glove, and I use that analogy in a 100% positive way.

I hope that you can continue to find ways to reward and recognize Deputy Santos for his service. As citizens of Loudoun County, we are truly fortunate to have someone of his caliber and integrity looking out for us.



P.S. Over the course of the shift (4 pm – 4 am), I also interacted to a lesser extent with Lieutenant Sawyer, Deputies Brown, Taylor (male), and Taylor (female), and others— and they all handled their various encounters and activities professionally, without exception. I had the opportunity to meet a number of these folks over the course of CPA classes as well, so it was very cool to see them in action in the field.

Our deepest gratitude for serving on the panel for the recent Heritage Fellowship Church town hall, "The Church and Community Working Together."




