I would like to sincerely thank a member of your team, Deputy A. Tarad #3060, for his professionalism and willingness to do everything possible to locate the person that hit my car and absconded without providing their personal information.

This incident happened in the Wegmans Sterling parking lot on November 17, 2018. My sister and I was extremely impressed with his patience and how he explained in detail what would happen during the investigation process. We are so grateful for Deputy Tarad for his assistance. As you can imagine, it is disturbing when someone blatantly hits your car in daylight and just leaves.

Once the case was opened, it was reassuring to know that Deputy Tarad kept his word and followed up with me regarding the status of the case. Unfortunately, the person could not be located due to a camera/recording operational issues at Wegmans. Still, my thanks and appreciation to the Deputy Tarad for all his efforts.

Dear Sheriff Chapman:

Although I have great admiration and respect for the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office, this is the first time I've written about a particular officer. I have done so this time, because it is so well deserved.

On New Year's Day, near dusk, my husband and I pulled on to Route 50 after dropping packages off at our son's new home in Aldie. We were about a mile from my son's home when I made the turn on to Route 50 near Gilbert's Corner. I forgot I had placed my keys on top of our Rav-4 (my husband had an extra set that I was using) and as I completed the 45 degree turn, I heard a clattering noise on the top of the vehicle and remembered the keys. Because of traffic, I couldn't pull to the shoulder until about a mile or so, beyond where I was sure I heard the keys fly off of the car. I turned the hazard lights on and my husband and I began slowly walking up the shoulder to see if we could find the keys. Although it was New Year's Day, traffic was fairly busy.

Within a few minutes, Deputy J. Nyce (#3112) saw our vehicle, parked his patrol car behind it, and very politely asked what we were doing. I explained, and he immediately put his flashing lights on to warn other drivers that we were there. Deputy Nyce got out of the car and began trailing us as we walked up the shoulder in our search. We did not see the keys and I thought they likely flew off the Rav-4 into the brush along the shoulder. I had little hope of seeing them again. I thanked Deputy Nyce for keeping us safe and drove further down Route 50 to find a drive to turn around to return to my son's house.

As we pulled into the driveway of our son's house, I glanced up and saw Deputy Nyce driving towards us, holding my keys! I was ecstatic. He explained that as I was turning my car around in a driveway, he could see the keys and retrieved them for us. He then followed us back to my son's house to return them to us.

Deputy Nyce was professional, courteous and went way beyond what I ever would have expected. Even though we remained on the shoulder as we walked up and down, he obviously knew it was dangerous for us to be on such a heavily traveled road. Instead of leaving us to fend for ourselves, he remained in the area, put on his flashing lights and ensured our safety. And then, after we had given up, and failed to see the keys in the shoulder of the road, he saw them and returned them safely to us.
