BOARD APPROVES MY MOTION TO EXPLORE RESIDENT CURATOR PROGRAM!

Last night, the Board unanimously approved my Motion directing County staff to research and return to the Board with a proposal for possible implementation of a Loudoun County Resident Curator (a.k.a., caretaker) Program!

If adopted, the new program would allow the use of private funding to better manage, preserve, maintain and/or operate County-owned historic properties. It could even allow private individuals to reside in a County-owned historic property for free, or at a reduced rate, in exchange for specific agreements to complete certain improvements within a specified timeframe.
