Coronavirus Update - March 16

Dear Catoctin Residents,

As I expected when I sent you my last email, things have indeed changed quickly. The Virginia Department of Health now reports we have [45 presumptive positive cases in Virginia](#), 5 of which are in Loudoun County.

In response, Loudoun County has made yet more changes to its programs, and is now closing its Adult Day Care Centers, all Public Library branches, and all Parks & Rec facilities.

We'll continue to push regular updates to my [Facebook page](#), and will send emails like this for larger or more urgent updates. We also recommend checking the [County's coronavirus webpage](#), which includes a page on [exactly which County programs have been changed or cancelled](#).

**Closing Adult Day Care Centers, Public
Libraries, Parks & Rec Facilities**

Adult Day Care Centers Closed

All Adult Day Care centers are now closed until further notice.

Public Libraries Closed

All ten library branches are now closed. They are setting up a curbside pickup service, which they will start offering later in the week. Library officials [plan to explain more about this curbside service on Tuesday](#).

Loudoun County Public Library is also giving new customers who sign up online 6 months to pick up their permanent library cards. (Before now, patrons had to visit a branch within 30 days of registering online.)

Recreation Centers and Community Centers Closed

All of these centers are closed and their programs are cancelled, at least through April 1, 2020.

County parks will remain open for self-directed trail and leisure use during normal operating hours. But all park offices and athletic complexes will be closed. Playground equipment will be routinely cleaned.

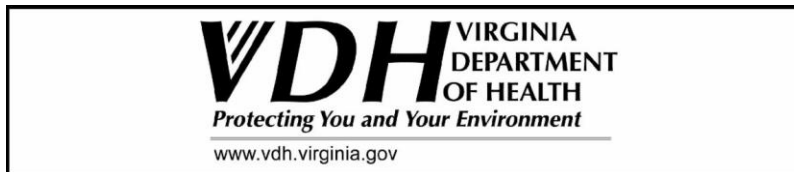

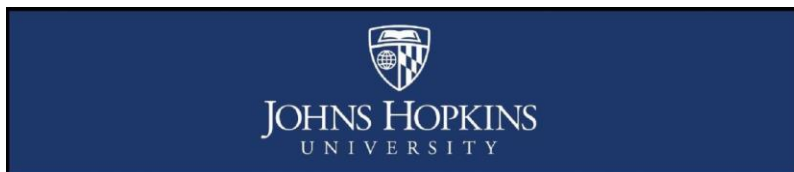
