Safety Measures and Social Distancing to Keep Loudoun County Firefighters Ready to Respond



As our region continues to deal with the spread of COVID-19, firefighters, emergency medical professionals and 9-1-1 dispatchers within the Loudoun County Combined Fire and Rescue System (LC-CFRS) remain fully staffed and ready to answer your call. **Emergency response will not change and there have been no reductions in service. Call or text 9-1-1 if you are having an emergency!**

In order to protect our first responders, essential employees and citizens from additional risk of exposure to COVID-19, LC-CFRS has instituted several operational practices as well as social distancing sanctions

Fire stations will be closed to the public and any non-essential personnel.

Food donations from the public will not be accepted at LC-CFRS stations and worksites.

Public events scheduled at any LC-CFRS Stations or with LC-CFRS personnel have been postponed or cancelled until further notice.

The 2020 Census is now open!

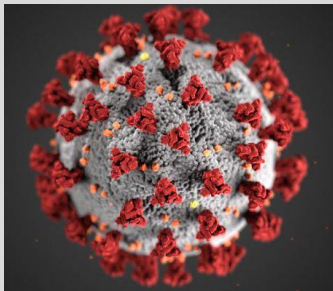

Residents should receive an invitation to respond online by March 20, or can simply visit www.2020Census.gov. It takes only 10 minutes by computer or smartphone, is available in 13 languages, and your answers are confidential.

The county continues to encourage everyone in the community to take steps to limit the spread of COVID-19, which include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer only if soap and water are not available.
