

## MWCOG Report: Loudoun Crime Rate Continues Decline, Lowest in Region

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office reported the lowest crime rate in the region according to the Annual Report on Crime and Crime Control released this week by the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (MWCOG).

In 2014, the rate of serious crimes saw 8.307 crimes per 1000 residents in Loudoun and is a 17% decrease in crime since 2012 when Loudoun County Sheriff Mike Chapman took office. The 2014 crime rate was the lowest crime rate reported by any of the 22 regional law enforcement agencies from Maryland, Virginia and Washington, DC who partner with MWCOG.

Part I crimes remain on a steady decline according to a recent report to be presented next week to the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors. The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office quarterly significant incident report shows a 21% decrease in the number of serious crimes between January and July of 2014 and 2015.

"The continued decrease in serious crimes in the county is remarkable due to the continued extraordinary growth Loudoun is experiencing," noted Loudoun Sheriff Mike Chapman. "I attribute this drop in crime to the diligent work of our deputies, detectives and civilian staff. Their enforcement, education, and prevention efforts are having a significant impact on crime," Chapman added.

The MWCOG Annual Report on Crime and Crime Control focuses on Part I offenses as defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigations including homicide, aggravated assault, rape, robbery, burglary, auto theft and larceny. The report was released on July 8th and can be found online

## LCSO Deputies Recognized for Life-Saving Actions during Suicide Attempt

Two Loudoun deputies are being lauded for their efforts in helping save the life of a man who attempted to take his own life last month.

On May 23rd, Deputy First Class Dustin Moon and Deputy First Class James Maguire, Jr., responded to a residence in the Cascades area after dispatchers received information from a third party caller that a man was attempting to take his own life. The man was reportedly in a running vehicle in his garage.

The deputies arrived on scene and found the home and the garage door locked. DFC Moon used his car jack while DFC Maguire used his collapsible baton to partially open the garage door to allow the fumes being emitted from the vehicle to escape. Seeing that they were not going to be able to open the garage door further to gain entry, Deputy Maguire forced open the front door of the home.

Inside the garage, Deputy Maguire found a man seated in the vehicle and unconscious. He worked to turn off the car while DFC Moon helped to remove the man from the vehicle. Both deputies began to feel the effects of the carbon monoxide as he was pulled to safety.

The man was taken to a local hospital where he fully recovered and was able to receive further treatment. Both Moon and Maguire were treated at the scene for exposure to carbon monoxide.

## LCSO Reminds Residents to Secure Garage Doors After Burglaries in Ashburn

The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office is reminding residents to lock their vehicles and close garage doors after several burglaries have been reported in the Dulles South area where a garage door was used to gain entry.

In light of these recent cases, the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office is asking residents to close garage doors when you are not outside, lock your vehicles or park them inside a closed garage, and secure all exterior windows and doors.

As part of the agency's efforts to prevent crimes in the community, the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Section offers free home security surveys. ## Alert Loudoun

Alert Loudoun is the notification system the county uses to send citizens emergency information, news releases, traffic information, weather alerts, and more.

The system will send you **information you need wherever you are**. For example, subscribers may register to receive weather alerts that affect not only their home address, but also their work location, their children's day care provider, their children's school, or their parents' home.

The Alert Loudoun system also gives subscribers the ability to customize how they receive information – by text, email, cellphone and/or mobile app. The new system will first send a message to what you designate as your primary means of notification. If it doesn't reach you that way, it will try another method.

#### Report a Crime Online

Welcome to the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Citizens Online Police Reporting System. **If this is an Emergency or a crime is in progress/just occurred, please call 911.** Using this online citizen crime reporting system allows you to submit a report without leaving your home; however, not every crime can be reported. Please confirm the following to find out if online citizen crime reporting is right for you:

- This is not an emergency?
- This incident occurred within Loudoun County?
- This is not a motor vehicle crash or hit and run?

If you answered yes to all of the above questions, you are ready to file your report online. Please make sure to turn off your pop-up blocking software before filing the report. If you answered no to any of the questions, please look at our [Online Crime Reporting Frequently Asked Questions](#) section. Upon completion of this report process you will:

- See the words: "Your online police report has been submitted" showing that your report is complete.
- Be given a temporary report number.
- Be able to print a copy of the temporary report to keep for your records.

Please Note:

- All cases filed using the Citizen's Online Crime Reporting System will be reviewed.
- Upon review, if further investigation of your case is needed, you may be contacted.
- **Filing a false police report is a CRIME.**

Anyone found to have submitted a false police report will be prosecuted under the authority of Virginia State Code §18.2-161, which shall be punishable as a Class 1 misdemeanor. Maximum possible penalty is one year in jail and/or \$2,500 fine. The Loudoun County Sheriff's Office Citizen's Online Crime Reporting System accepts the following types of incidents:

Incident Type	Definition	Examples
Alcohol Violation	When alcohol is consumed by a person under the age of 21, sold to a person under the age of 21 or purchased for a person under the age of 21.	Underage parties where persons less than 21 are consuming alcohol, locations where it is believed persons less than 21 are being sold alcohol or where persons are suspected of purchasing alcohol for those less than 21 years of age.
Civil Dispute	A disagreement between people or groups in which no criminal laws are broken.	Child custody disputes, neighbor disputes, common property disputes, etc.
Credit Card Fraud	Occurs when the credit card or credit card number(s) are used fraudulently without the consent of the cardholder.	Your wallet is lost or stolen and purchases are made on your credit card without your consent. An unauthorized purchase appears on your credit card statement from an online retailer.
Credit Card Theft	Taking or obtaining of credit card(s), or credit card number(s), with the intent to use them fraudulently.	Your credit card is stolen from your person or your credit card number is stolen by an unknown person.
Destruction of Property/Vandalism	The act of changing, modifying or defacing public or private property.	A vehicle was damaged on the exterior, but no parts were removed or entry was made into the vehicle.
Fraud/False Pretense	Fraudulently obtaining or selling goods and services.	Construction work intentionally undone. False internet products or returns. Non-delivery of tickets.
Harassing Phone Calls/Emails	Unwanted phone calls or e-mail of an annoying, harassing nature.	Immediate phone hang-ups, obscene language, etc. with no known suspects.
Identity Theft	Obtaining another's personal identifying information and using it to obtain credit, goods or services.	Someone obtains a credit card using your Social Security Number or obtains phone service using your personal information.
Larceny/Theft	Your property is taken without your permission.	Someone takes your cellular phone without permission. Lost property is not a theft.
Lost Property	Property is missing or lost.	This is not theft of property. Does not include lost passports, social security cards or driver's licenses.
Narcotics Activity	Suspected narcotics activity.	Includes suspected sales of narcotics, traffic indicating the sale of narcotics, consumption of illegal narcotics.
Shoplifting	Property is taken from a business without paying.	Someone steals consumable product from a business and leaves without paying. This includes concealment.
Suspicious Event/Circumstance	Suspicious activity that you wish for the Sheriff's Office to know about, but is not necessarily a crime.	Someone you do not know hangs out on your street corner for several hours every afternoon. Cars that you do not recognize are parked in front of your home and then leave at all hours of the night. Your neighbor has frequent visitors that only stay for a couple of minutes at a time.
