**BACKGROUND:** The Sheriff's Office compiles a variety of reports to ensure information dissemination to senior staff and affected personnel of significant incidents, crime analysis and traffic issues. Because many of these reports contain sensitive and confidential information, they are not released outside of the department. Additionally, State law governs the dissemination of records, criminal history and other law enforcement information and provides penalties for improper release. To inform the public, a brief activity summary that complies with applicable law is prepared daily by the Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer and disseminated to the media, the Board of Supervisors and other interested parties.

The statistics that are summarized in the Sheriff's Significant Incident Report and submitted to the Board of Supervisors on a quarterly basis are Significant Incidents, Continuing Trends, Part 1 Crimes, Part 2 Crimes, Warrant Arrests, Traffic Statistics, Loudoun County Corrections and Courts Statistics. **\*Crime statistics are based on reports submitted to CAD as of 09/24/2014.**












