Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Global Webinar Series

Condo at One Loudoun for Sale through Loudoun Affordable Market Purchase Program


The Loudoun County Affordable Market Purchase Program (AMPP) has a unit available in the One Loudoun development. The Loudoun AMPP enables eligible first-time homeowners with moderate income the opportunity to purchase a newly constructed townhouse or condominium. A one-bedroom condominium is immediately available in the One Loudoun community for \$280,000.



The AMPP is one of several programs administered by the Loudoun County Office of Housing to increase affordable housing opportunities for Loudoun's low- to moderate-income households, including homebuyers and renters, as well as nonprofits and affordable housing developers.

Guide to Face Coverings



Governor Northam held a press conference yesterday on the status of COVID-19 in the Commonwealth. He reported that statewide case numbers are increasing, largely due to rising cases in the eastern portion of the state, with an average of 346 new cases per day. He attributes the increase to socializing without wearing a mask, particularly in the 20-29 age group.

We all play a role in slowing the spread of coronavirus in our community and preventing Loudoun and Northern Virginia from becoming hot spots. Wearing cloth face coverings that cover your nose and mouth and keeping a safe distance, 6 feet or more, from others are two ways to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

Dogs receiving vaccinations at this clinic will also receive a complimentary one-year Loudoun County license.

We recognize the hardships that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) public health emergency imposes on our customers. PRCS Hosts "Ferris Bueller's Day Off" Drive-In Movie July 31


The Loudoun County Department of Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) will host "Ferris Bueller's Day Off" Friday, July 31, 2020.

Tickets will be available for sale [online](#) on Thursday, July 16, starting at 12:00 pm.



Ten "picnic plots" (for up to five individuals attending together) have been added in front of the movie screen. Plots sell for \$40 and can accommodate blankets or lawn chairs.

COVID-19 One-Stop Shop Toolkits





Virginia Department of Health Expands COVID-19 Regional Data Reporting

Yesterday, the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) began providing the COVID-19 Key Measures for additional regions across the state: Central, Eastern, Northwest and Southwest. Previously, VDH only provided statewide and Northern Region key measures; data is now provided for all regions in the state. The new regional dashboards are available on the Key Measures [webpage](#).



For each region, a separate dashboard will include the following information:

- Number of cases by date reported
- Number of cases by date of symptom onset
- Number of deaths by date reported
- Number of deaths by date on the death certificate
- Number of testing encounters, number of positive testing encounters and percent positivity by
- lab report date, PCR only

- Number of testing encounters by lab report date, PCR only
- Number of hospital beds occupied and available
- Number of patients hospitalized with a positive or pending COVID-19 test
- Number of hospitals in the region reporting difficulty acquiring personal protective equipment
- (PPE) in the next 72 hours

LC-CFRS Joins Nextdoor to Connect with Loudoun Neighborhoods





The county continues to encourage everyone in the community to take steps to limit the spread of COVID-19, which include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer only if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when coughing or sneezing.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Avoid contact with sick people.
- Avoid non-essential travel.
