> The reason I am sending you this email is to bring one of your Deputy's conduct to your attention. I'm certain that you and your department receive a fair share of negative communications about your deputies. Please be assured that is not the purpose of my email.

> As you may recall on the evening of July 2, 2015 I sent an email (including a small video) to you and to Chairman York regarding ongoing noise issues from various Broadlands Homeowners Association (BHOA) events. I also stated my frustration with a lack of codified noise ordinance.

>
> Earlier today I received an email from Deputy Young, asking me to contact her. We had a very productive and informative telephone conversation. But what struck me the most was her level of professionalism, which was closely followed by her recollection of a noise complaint I had filed almost a year ago. She also explained to me, that she has been in contact with the BHOA. And indicated that your department has taken a proactive "community" approach. This approach is clearly working. Last weekend was the first time in almost 2 years my young child was not awoken by sounds of a BHOA event bouncing off his windows. I think the most incredible data point is, Deputy Young clearly understands this isn't just an issue for my family. Having a codified noise ordinance is a benefit for all residents of Loudoun County and it grants your dedicated staff the ability of enforcement. Without a noise ordinance, your deputies (for a lack of better terms), have nothing to enforce, if a citizen calls in a noise complaint.

> In closing, please let Deputy Young know that her hard work and dedication is greatly appreciated. And that my family and I are grateful for your department's Community approach.

We were under the impression that he was the officer who conducted the initial raid on the thief's home and we are fully aware that without he and his partner's assistance (and the remainder of the wonderful force in Loudoun County), we would not have gotten a penny of our \$10,000 back. For that we are very grateful.
