

Lieutenant Lee Williams #2617 and the two officers we spoke with when we called 911. Lieutenant Williams of the Loudoun County Sheriffs Office assisted my husband and I about three months ago. (Please forgive my tardiness in writing this note). We were on our way home from West Virginia at about 11:45am when we struck something in the road that caused two flat tires. We pulled off the main road and onto a very dark and deserted side street. We were an hour from home and knew no one in the area. We decided to call 911. The officers on the phone were very professional and assured us an officer would be out to us as soon as possible. A short time later Lieutenant Williams arrived. We explained what happened and Lieutenant Williams told us something had fallen off of a truck on the main road and that we were one of four cars that were effected. From that point on Lieutenant Williams took over the situation. He told us he would call a towing company and informed us that our insurance might pay for any out of pocket costs. Lieutenant Williams told us if our car was towed he would personally drive us home (an hour away). The towing truck did arrive shortly. The tow driver towed our car to an auto shop where it was repaired the next morning. In this time when police officers are not seen in the best light, I am thankful that officers like Lieutenant Williams do exist. He was professional, compassionate, patient and understanding. God bless Lieutenant Williams and the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office.




Dear Sheriff Chapman:
